

WHY YOUR DOG PULLS

GETTING ACCESS TO SOMETHING HE WANTS

Most dogs pull because they're getting rewarded in some way. For instance, if your dog wants to smell something on the floor he might pull in a certain direction.

the moment that you allowed your dog to get access to what he wanted. your dog learns that if he pulls hard enough he gets what he wants.

ON-LEASH GREETING

The biggest mistake owners make initially is allowing on leash greetings on-leash greeting eventually become a habit to your dog. Some dogs can become obsessed to the point where every time your dog sees another pup he wants to pull.

LETTING YOUR DOG WALK ON TENSION

Allowing your dog to walk on leash tension is essentially teaching your dog to pull, you ultimately want your with no tension on the leash. Only using tension to communicate to your dog which direction to go.

GUIDELINES MOVING FORWARD

- Dont allow your dog to get access to something he's pullin to
- Don't allow your dog to walk while theres tention on the leash
- No on-leash greetings

HOW TO:

HOW TO TAKE DIRECTOIN

Apply tension on the leash to the side(left or right) when your dog walks in the given direction release all tension
